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SUPERVISED RELEASE

Upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be on supervised release for a term of **10 years**.

The defendant must report to the probation office in the district to which the defendant is released within 72 hours of release from the custody of the Bureau of Prisons.

The defendant shall not commit another federal, state or local crime.

The defendant shall not unlawfully possess a controlled substance. The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter, as determined by the court.

- The above drug testing condition is suspended, based on the court's determination that the defendant poses a low risk of future substance abuse.
- The defendant shall not possess a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or any other dangerous weapon.
- The defendant shall cooperate in the collection of DNA as directed by the probation officer.
- The defendant shall comply with the requirements of the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (42 U.S.C. § 16901, *et seq.*) As directed by the probation officer, the Bureau of Prisons, or any state sex offender registration agency in which he or she resides, works, is a student, or was convicted of a qualifying offense.
- The defendant shall participate in an approved program for domestic violence.

If this judgment imposes a fine or restitution, it is a condition of supervised release that the defendant pay in accordance with the Schedule of Payments sheet of this judgment.

The defendant must comply with the standard conditions that have been adopted by this court as well as with any additional conditions on the attached page.

STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

- 1. The defendant shall not leave the judicial district without the permission of the court or probation officer;
- 2. The defendant shall report to the probation officer in a manner and frequency directed by the court or probation officer;
- 3. The defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow the instructions of the probation officer;
- 4. The defendant shall support his or her dependents and meet other family responsibilities;
- 5. The defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation, unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training, or other acceptable reasons;
- 6. The defendant shall notify the probation officer at least ten (10) days prior to any change in residence or employment;
- 7. The defendant shall refrain from use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any controlled substance or any paraphernalia related to any controlled substances, except as prescribed by a physician;
- 8. The defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered;
- 9. The defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony, unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
- 10. The defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view by the probation officer;
- 11. The defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two (72) hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer;
- 12. The defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court; and
- 13. As directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics, and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.

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SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

- 1. The defendant shall participate in a program of mental health treatment, as directed by the probation officer, until such time as the defendant is released from the program by the probation officer, and shall pay at least a portion of the cost according to his/her ability, as determined by the probation officer.
- 2. The defendant shall provide the probation officer with access to any requested financial information.
- 3. The defendant shall not associate with or have any contact with convicted sex offenders unless in a therapeutic setting and with the permission of the probation officer.
- 4. The defendant shall not be employed in any position or participate as a volunteer in any activity that involves contact with children under the age of 18, except as approved by the probation officer.
- 5 The defendant shall be required to provide a detailed itinerary of vacations and leisure activities, including all persons with whom he interacted or had contact.
- 6. The defendant shall have no contact with minors (under the age of 18) without the written approval of the probation officer and shall refrain from entering into any area where children frequently congregate including, but not limited to schools, day care centers, theme parks, theaters, and playgrounds.
- 7. The defendant shall not possess any materials depicting sexually explicit conduct as defined in 18 U.S.C. §2256(2)(A)(I)-(v), including visual, auditory, telephonic, or electronic media, and computer programs or services. He shall not patronize any place whose primary purpose is to promote such materials or entertainment. The defendant shall not utilize 900 or adult telephone numbers or any other sex-related numbers.
- 8. The defendant shall advise the probation officer of all pornographic materials owned or possessed by the defendant and shall not own or possess any sexually stimulating or sexually oriented material deemed inappropriate by the probation officer and/or treatment staff.
- 9. The defendant shall participate in the Computer/Internet Monitoring Program and shall comply with the rules of the program as directed by the U.S. Probation Office. The defendant shall pay the cost of computer monitoring as directed by the probation officer.
- 10 The defendant shall consent to periodic announced or unannounced examination of his computer or computer-related devices by the U.S. Probation Office or authorized designee. Examinations based on reasonable suspicion of violation conduct or illegal activity may result in seizure of such systems for a more thorough examination.
- 11. The defendant shall refrain from all use of alcoholic beverages.
- 12. The defendant shall also comply with the requirements of the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (42 U.S.C. § 16901, et seq.) as directed by the probation officer, the Bureau of Prisons, or any state sex offender registration agency in which he or she resides, works, is a student, or was convicted of a qualifying offense.

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13. The defendant shall be monitored by a form of location monitoring technology at the discretion of the probation officer for a period of 6 months and shall abide by all technology requirements. The participant shall pay all or part of the costs of participation in the location monitoring program as directed by the court or probation officer.

The form of location monitoring technology shall be utilized to monitor the following restriction on the defendant's movement in the community as well as other court-imposed conditions of release.

(X) Home Detention: You are restricted to your residence at all times except for employment; education; religious services; medical, substance abuse, or mental health treatment; attorney visits; court appearances; court-ordered obligations; or other activities as pre-approved by the probation officer.

- 14 The defendant shall submit his person, property, house, residence, vehicle, papers, computers (as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 1030(e)(1)), other electronic communications or data storage devices or media, or office, to a search conducted by a United States probation officer. Failure to submit to a search may be grounds for revocation of release. The defendant shall warn any other occupants that the premises may be subject to searches pursuant to this condition.
- 15 An officer may conduct a search pursuant to this condition only when reasonable suspicion exists that the defendant has violated a condition of his supervision and that the areas to be searched contain evidence of this violation. Any search must be conducted at a reasonable time and in a reasonable manner.
- 16. The defendant shall notify everyone he lives near or resides with that he is on supervised release as a sex offender.
- 17. The defendant shall have no contact with the victims in this matter.

All criminal monetary penalties, except those payments made through the Federal Bureau of Prisons' Inmate Financial Responsibility Program, are made to the Clerk of the Court, 399 Federal Building, 110 Michigan N.W., Grand Rapids, MI 49503, unless otherwise directed by the court, the probation officer, or the United States Attorney.

The defendant shall receive credit for all payments previously made toward any criminal monetary penalties imposed.
